### Plan Descriptions

A description of how the funds will be used to increase or improve services for foster youth, low-income students, and English learners to improve A-G eligibility

The funds will increase/improve services for the specified groups because they will have AP-certified teachers supporting them, they will have targeted tutoring available to them in English and Spanish (for English Learners), and because they will have additional support to successfully pass preparation coursework and actual A-G courses in the form of tutoring.

A description of the extent to which all students, including foster youth, low-income students, and English learners, will have access to A-G courses approved by the University of California.

Compass Charter Schools ensures A-G online course access to all scholars including foster youth, low-income scholars, and English learners. We maintain oversight and a yearly review of all A-G courses within our course list and offer a complete sequence of courses within all 15 categories (including project-based course options).

The number of students who were identified for opportunities to retake A-G approved courses in which they received a “D”, “F”, or “Fail” grade in the 2020 spring semester or the 2020-21 school year and a description of the method used to offer the opportunity retake courses.

Number of Scholars: 112

Compass Charter Schools, during the 2020-21 school year across all three charter schools, had a total of 217 scholars who were identified to retake A-G courses with a grade of “D”, “F” or Fail. Our program provides ample opportunities for scholars to retake courses during fall, spring and/or summer terms for all A-G courses. We also offer online credit recovery courses in the summer term.

A description of how the plan and described services, and associated expenditures, if applicable, supplement services in the Local Control and Accountability Plan and Learning Recovery Plan.

In addition to our existing offerings in our LCAP, we will have special tutoring service available for just our unduplicated scholars; this is in addition to our regular tutoring program offered as a support for our MTSS framework. Our LCAP includes professional development on a variety of topics, but did not specify AP certification training for staff; this will supplement the other professional development already identified in our LCAP.
